Grand Paris Express Station

With lines 11, 15 South and 16 interconnected to the RER A at Noisy - Champs station, Cité Descartes, located just 25 minutes from the centre of Paris, will become a new hub in Greater Paris, the epicentre of a new way of conceiving and living in the city. The opening of the Grand Paris Express line 15 South at the end of 2025 will be the first step in this dimensional shift.

The future Noisy-Champs station of the Grand Paris Express and the construction sites surrounding it form a 1 km long area, one of the largest of the Grand Paris Express. Work began at the end of 2016 on the rear station and mid-2017 on the front station.

Built around the RER A tracks, the station will eventually bring together the new metro lines and RER line A under its Chinese roof. The RER will pass under the central hall below the street; line 15 South will run on level -1 with platforms 13.5 m below ground, and line 16, from 2018, on level -2, located 21 m below ground. Outside, a bus station will provide connections with 10 or so bus lines.

With a total of 6 accesses, it will efficiently service the surrounding districts and their 23,000 inhabitants within a radius of 1 km. It is expected to see a football of up to 150,000 passengers per day.
